The City has received a large number of notifications from residents about West Point Road between County Road 19 and Fairhope Avenue. There has been unsafe traffic and pedestrian conditions; degradation and deterioration; encroachment upon wetlands; and potential of the outbreak of disease.

RESOLUTION NO. 14-

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PLACEMENT OF
“NO PARKING” SIGNAGE ON WEST POINT ROAD**

WHEREAS, vehicle parking along West Point Road has created unsafe traffic and pedestrian conditions, has created degradation and deterioration of West Point Road, has encroached upon wetland areas, has contributed to littering and has created the potential for the outbreak of disease inasmuch as there are no public facilities to accommodate human needs along West Point Road; and

WHEREAS, the above conditions impair the safety, health and good order of the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, based upon the files and records of the City of Tonka Bay regarding the above factors,

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Tonka Bay as follows: that the placement of “No Parking” signage along West Point Road as shown on Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby authorized and that City staff is hereby directed to attend to the placement of said signage.


