

## CHAPTER 11 MISDEMEANORS

### SECTION 1140 PENALTIES

#### **1140.01**      **General Rule**

As provided in §1100.03 of this Code, any person who violates any provision of this Code is guilty of a misdemeanor. Each set of violation and every day on which a violation occurs or continues is a separate violation.

#### **1140.02**      **Exceptions**

Where a provision of this Code or a statute adopted by reference therein sets a lesser penalty or a different period constituting a violation than set out in §1140.01, such Code or statutory provision shall prevail.

#### **1140.03**      **Misdemeanor**

Any person found guilty of a misdemeanor shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not to exceed seven hundred dollars (\$700.00), or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days.

#### **1140.04**      **Petty Misdemeanor**

Specific mention of a violation of any of the provisions of this Code as being a “petty misdemeanor”, shall mean that, upon conviction a sentence of a fine of not more than \$100.00 may be imposed. In the absence of the designation of “petty misdemeanor” in connection with any violation, such violation shall be a penal offense as set forth in §1140.03 of this Code.

#### **1140.05**      **Penalty for Violation of State Statute Provisions Incorporated by Reference.**

Where a state statute, incorporated into this Code by reference, does not expressly prohibit the imposition of stricter penalties, and where this Code imposes stricter penalties than those imposed by state statute, the penalties imposed by this Code shall be applied. In all other cases, those penalties imposed for violation of a state statute shall be applied.

#### **1140.06**      **Revocation of License**

Violation by a licensee of any provision of this Code or State Law, regulating, prescribing conditions, or establishing requirements relative to licenses or permits held by such licensee shall be grounds for revocation of such license or permit. Revocation of any license or permit shall comply with provisions set out in §401.06 of this Code.
